2022/23 has been a great year with member groups having exhibitions and events across Victoria, as everything has now returned to normal after the restrictions of the past few years.

Membership

This year some of our smaller groups have found it difficult to keep their members and several have had to close, however we have been pleased to welcome other new groups to Victorian Quilters Inc..

The committee has decided to create a Life Membership award, to recognize long-term members who have made significant contributions to Victorian Quilters Inc. We are pleased to be presenting four Life Memberships at this year's Annual Meeting.

Very Snuggly Quilts Auxiliary

The Victorian Quilters Very Snuggly Quilt Auxiliary, volunteer distribution team was finally able to return to the Royal Childrens Hospital, in December 2022, to again donate quilts to the children. This monthly activity results in up to 200 quilts being distributed every visit. Thank you so much to all the members and friends of Victorian Quilters Inc. who over the years have donated to the Very Snuggly Quilt program. All quilts are given anonymously, but they have a VSQ tag, so we can identify the giver. As this tag has details about the VSQ program, we often receive grateful thanks. If this program appeals to you, we are always looking for more volunteers.

Victorian Quilters Inc. are pleased to have continued our very important partnership with Expertise Events (EE) at our two major events this year.

Australasian Quilt Convention April 13-16, 2023. Victorian Quilters Inc. are the Guild partner for EE and we will continue this partnership next year. Thank you to all Victorian Quilters Inc. volunteers who helped stage the quilt exhibition by putting up and packing down quilt stands and quilts; being tutor helpers and doing white glove duty. By the end of the 2022-2023 year Victorian Quilters has 495 members. This includes 86 Groups and 409 Individual members. Our membership cohort has both a national and international base. We have welcomed 40 new members.

Quilt Showcase

We had another successful quilt show this year. Expertise Events decided to hold the show on a Wednesday to Saturday for the first time. Visitor numbers seemed down on Wednesday so I am not sure if the public realised the change.

Members and visitors to the show enjoyed seeing the amazing quilts, catching up with friends, making new friends and shopping. As well as the quilts in our judged show, we had a wonderful range of traditional quilts on display from our Profile a Quilter, Mary Hitchens. In contrast to Mary's quilts, we displayed 20 quilts by the Melbourne Modern Quilt Guild. Jan Preston presented her Courage and Determination exhibition which told the touching story of her Father-in-law during World War 2, many tears were shed and many visitors recounted their own family stories.

Thank you to our members who entered their quilts and congratulations to those that won a prize. Please remember, that our show is more than winning a prize and we welcome all quilts into our show, especially those simple or beginner quilts. We want to encourage new quilters, who can sometimes be discouraged by so many excellent quilts, so please consider entering your quilt in 2024, your quilt is very welcome.

Thank you to the Quilt Collection volunteers, these ladies not only collect and transport your quilts, they also help with the putting up and taking down of the show, so their support is invaluable to Victorian Quilters. This year we had 162 entries and the most popular category was again the Mainly Pieced section, it seems that everyone loves piecing and traditional quilts are just as popular as ever in Victoria

The Judges, Rachelle Denneny from South Australia and Jenny Bacon and Robyn Roberts reported that the standard of quilts was very high.

On behalf of all members, we also extend congratulations to Mariya Waters for her spectacular Best of Show quilt, Floral Symphony no. 2.

Our most valuable asset are the volunteers who attend to the tasks that make the presentation look so professional & sophisticated. Unfortunately, some of these volunteers are experiencing strength & stamina challenges. We need more able bodies to spread the work load. Very Snuggly Quilts

We have returned to a post COVID world, and some things have returned to back to normal, although we have changed in many ways. COVID gave us the time to reflect on how and why we did many things, and many have chosen to do things a little differently.

Josephine Kelly coordinates the distribution of quilts and you may deliver completed quilts to her at a mutually agreeable time. Please remember that Josephine has a full-time job and we need to work in with her schedule.

Elaine Hicks continues to coordinate the volunteers who deliver the quilts to the hospital. We are very privileged to be able to enter the wards and there are agreed protocols that cover the legal requirements of delivering quilts to children who have chronic illnesses and special needs.

Marie Lee OAM will continue to answer enquiries relating to donations of completed quilts and fabric and then distributing items / fabric onto other charitable organisations. We have amassed a considerable amount of fabric and have sorted and sold some fabric during the year. The money raised has contributed to paying for storage of the quilts and fabric. Recently I have been approaching local Guilds to take donations.

During COVID we donated quilts to BackPacks4VicKids and I know many of you have also made donations to this organisation. As we have many quilts in storage, I have been suggesting that instead of making quilts you may like to make Santa Sacks for BackPacks.

There are so many quilters that enjoy piecing quilts but due to a number of factors are unable to quilt these quilts so I will be seeking quilters. We have many quilts in storage and we will let you know when we need more quilts. At this time I will not be recommencing quilt making days - yes I will miss the happy times spent with you.

We recommenced visiting the RCH in December 2022 and everyone is pleased to see the Quilt Ladies back and making the children smile when they receive a quilt. The quilts also lift the spirits of the staff and visitors at the hospital. This program is only possible due to the many generous quilters who freely give their time and fabric to creating wonderful bright quilts. Never underestimate the difference each quilt makes to the child and their families.

Exford Primary School

You will remember the horrific accident that involved the school bus carrying student's home from the Exford Primary School earlier this year.

The first people at the accident scene included the Principal, teachers and volunteer first responders, some of whom worked at the school. The impact this accident had on the school community was huge. There are nearly 400 students and approximately 60 of these students, from every class in the school, were on the bus. A number of children were admitted to the Royal Children's Hospital and in the normal course of events, these children would have received a quilt.

After a committee discussion it was decided that Victorian Quilters Inc. would donate a quilt to every child at the school. It did not seem fair to only give the children on the bus a quilt when their class mates had been so traumatised by the accident. President Judith Oke, Elaine Hicks, Kaye Schonewille and I visited the school and delivered the quilts.

The Principal wrote "Thank you and your wonderful team of quilters for the generous and kind donation of quilts for our kids. I've looked at some of the photos and the delight on their faces says it all! These quilts will bring such comfort and I'm sure will have pride of place in their homes".

A parent wrote: "My kids just recently received your wonderful artwork at Exford Primary School. They were so happy and couldn't stop exploring every tiny detail on their unique gifts They now constantly play with the quilts and wrap themselves in them every other moment. The creativity, love and skills behind these items are so amazing! Thank you so much for these wonderful gifts!"

Thank you for your continued support of the Very Snuggly Quilt Program, your generosity is very much appreciated by the children, their families and the staff at the Royal Children's Office and also those connected with the Exford Primary School.
