Open to all textile artists in Australia & New Zealand, not just members of VQ. Held biennially, and in keeping with the contemporary theme, OSF is for entrants who wish to push the boundaries of quilt making. A maximum of 2 entries per person permitted. I am asking if you have a passion for the patchwork & quilting community and/or transferrable skills to offer us. Because it is vital that more members become involved in the management of VicQuilters.

- If you are recently retired and looking for something extra in your life, why not continue to use the valuable skills you have developed throughout your career/ living life.
- If you have been involved in quilt groups for a number of years you have knowledge and experience VicQuilters can benefit from.
- Starting again, why not start with becoming more involved with VicQuilters, with opportunities to make friends and meet quilters from everywhere.

We are seeking interested people to join our team in the following roles:

. Assistant Secretary – to start immediately with a view to stepping up into Secretary in November 2024.

If you are a fluent communicator comfortable with organizing yourself, why not bring your skills to this role. These days most communication is done by email, and meetings are by zoom, so a lot of the necessary business is completed electronically and at your convenience at home.

. Assistant Treasurer – to start immediately with a view to stepping up into Treasurer in November 2024.

If you are someone experienced in banking / accounting and/or managing financial matters, why not bring your experience to this role. The Treasurer manages the finances of VQ, keeping accurate records and attending to the audit functions. The current Treasurer has streamlined the process as VicQuilters uses online banking and most payments are managed through our website.



. Vice President – to start immediately with a view to stepping up into President in November 2025.

The VP is a general role which assists the President. As the President requires a good communicator who works well with others, VP provides a good grounding for this future role. You would be welcome to join me, learning what makes VicQuilters work and having the privilege of meeting quilters around Vic & NSW.

. Group Insurance – to start immediately.

This is not necessarily a Committee position, however sometimes the Vice President takes it on as a way to get to know the member groups. You will work with the President and have the support of the previous Group Insurance person. This role is suitable for someone who is comfortable talking to different people and likes to be organized. You do not need previous experience in insurance as we have very clear guidelines on how to do this task. Information and communication with groups has been streamlined.

. Assistant Exhibition Coordinator or someone to partner with another to be joint Exhibition Coordinators – to start immediately with a view to stepping up into the role in 2025.

If you have led or been part of planning a quilt or other similar exhibition, or worked on Showcase previously, why not consider stretching your wings and take on a leadership role in planning an amazing event. Details in Help Wanted in e-News.

Anyone taking on these positions is welcomed and supported by the present incumbents. Don't be doubtful, try it out, we have all learnt by doing.

Are you able to commit to being part of the team that leads Victorian Quilters Inc. for the next few years?

We thank the current committee members for their time and support of Victorian Quilters Inc. and we welcome Leonie Wolfe and Glenne Reid who recently joined the committee. It is not expected that it is a lifetime commitment to be on the committee and if you could commit for a period of three to five years. Experience is not necessary, the current committee is friendly and supportive, however, if you have been on a previous committee of an incorporated association, this would be an advantage, and you will need some computer skills and access to the internet.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS

There are approximately 6 committee meetings a year which are now held via zoom, so there is no travelling.

As a committee member it is expected that you will be able to attend and assist at Victorian Quilters Inc. events, including Quilt Showcase, Australasian Quilt Convention, Gatherings and represent Victorian Quilters Inc. at events being held by our member groups.

EXHIBITION COORDINATOR

This role oversees two main events during the year. Victorian Quilters work with Expertise Events to set up the quilts for AQC, usually in April and the staging of our annual members Showcase in July.

- Administration and communication skills are necessary.
- Experience in leading a team in any walk of life is an advantage.

You may have led or been part of planning an exhibition previously or you may have assisted at AQC or Vic Quilters Showcase. If so, this is an opportunity to become more involved in these landmark events.

The Exhibition Coordinator is supported by the Victorian Quilters committee and our fabulous and experienced members who volunteer to assist at these events.

The retiring Exhibition Coordinator is available to provide support as you gain experience. Note: this position may be held by one person working with an 'apprentice' or two people job sharing.

SHOWCASE ASSISTANCE

Assistance with set up of the quilt show. Monday 22 July, 2pm to 5pm (approx.) Tuesday 23 July, 7am to 5pm

Assistance to take down quilt show. Saturday 27 July, 4pm to 6.00pm (approx.)

QUILT COLLECTORS

Accept quilts for exhibit at Quilt Showcase. 12 July to 15 July.

Collection of Quilts by members. 25 July to 3 August.

Available to drop off the quilts & assist with quilt set up at the Exhibition Centre, Melbourne at 7am on **Tuesday 23 July 2024**.

Available to assist with take down at 4pm on Saturday 27 July. At the completion of take down, quilts will be returned to the collectors.

PREPARATION OF POWER POINT PRESENTATION

Prepare Power Point presentation prior to judging, including the sponsorship details.

On judging day, insert details of winning quilt, including photograph that was submitted with the entry.

Have a practise run through prior to the presentation to ensure that the projector is working.

Award ceremony present Power Point presentation.

SOCIAL MEDIA FACEBOOK AND INSTAGRAM

Attend showcase each day, take photographs of members with their entries, post on social media, acknowledge and promote the sponsors.

It is envisaged that this person will promote the Exhibition and our sponsors both before and after the exhibition.

SPONSORSHIP

There are a number of opportunities available in this team, including on judging day, including preparing and printing Certificates, checking the categories and that the prizes are correct.

There will be some work in the lead up to the Exhibition and you will be required at the Exhibition centre from 9am to 6pm on Tuesday 23 July and Wednesday 24 July.
