#### President's Report

I would like to thank all members of the Committee for their time and efforts during the past year. As President I have been supported by a great team of enthusiastic people on Committee. I have also enjoyed visiting member Groups, either as speaker or as a visitor to their events. It is a privilege to be able to be part of the many activities of members of Victorian Quilters Inc. As President I also represented Victorian Quilters Inc. at QuiltAustralia meetings. Held twice a year this is a meeting of all Presidents of State and Territories guilds.

The Committee welcomed Glenne Reid and Leonie Wolfe who joined as General Committee members at AGM 2023. During the year the Committee continued to meet regularly on Zoom, which was efficient and productive. Linda Steele, Showcase Convenor, also joined Committee meetings when Showcase 2024 was discussed.

The position of Vice President was vacant during the 2023-2024 year.

Jennifer Wain resigned as Treasurer at the end of the year. Jennifer has been an extremely capable and efficient Treasurer, and we thank her for her years of service to VicQuilters.

During 2024 Chris Serong retired as Quilt Archangel, responsible for coordinating our volunteers at AQC and Showcase. We are very appreciative of Chris's calm and confident organisational skills.

During 2023-24 the Appraisal sub-committee welcomed a new coordinator, Heather Shepherd working with Robyn Roberts & Yumi McKey.

Val Jackson has resigned as QuiltAustralia Coordinator after many years in this role. We thank her for her continued dedication to this role.

Significant decisions made by Committee 2023-2024:

VQ Gatherings door fee: VicQuilters will not keep the door fees for Gatherings held in 2025. While it is usual practice for VicQuilters to do so, any Group that hosts a Gathering in 2025 will be given the door entry fee. NOTE: VicQuilters do pay venue & speaker fee for a Gathering.

Group membership fee: The Committee will not propose any increase in Group membership fee. VicQuilters has funds on hand, Group insurance fee was increased for the coming year, Groups have generously supported Showcase 2024 and a large number of member Groups have under 25, or under 50 members.

Showcase 2024: There were no credit card/ EFTPOS fees charged on Showcase Entries.

#### Activities

In January 2024 all members of the Committee attended a productive planning day in which the current VicQuilters Policy & Procedures Handbook was reviewed. Committee members have continued to review policies during the year. Sections are shared with sub-committees as relevant.

Committee members attended three Gatherings hosted by member Groups and AGM Gathering hosted by VicQuilters. These Gatherings are a great opportunity to meet and greet with members.

VicQuilters was again pleased to work with Expertise Events at Australasian Quilt Convention, April 2024. VicQuilters volunteers are tutor's helpers and white glove helpers amongst the quilt displays during AQC. We were able to supply the volunteers needed for these roles. However, part of our arrangement is that VicQuilters also put up and take down the quilt displays organized by EE. Unfortunately, we had only a small group of volunteers present to do this in 2024. We will be reevaluating how we can comply with EE's requests to put up the quilt displays. It is important for members to know that because VicQuilters is part of AQC, we can have information tables, including raffle quilt, on display during AQC. This opportunity is invaluable to VicQuilters as a means of promoting membership and selling raffle tickets.

Showcase 2024 was a success for VicQuilters as we had a good number of entries, with many members and friends attending the Award Ceremony on the Wednesday. During the open days we noticed lots of people viewing the quilts and we made many contacts during the event. Thank you to all the volunteers who prepared and presented Showcase to the public. Thank you for all our sponsors, major and minor, who all made a valuable contribution to the success of Showcase. We continue to have confidence in our association with Expertise Events and look forward to participating in Melbourne Craft & Quilt Fair in September 2025.

Victorian Quilters Inc. is an organisation that is run for the benefit of our individual and group members. Its aim is to promote patchwork & quilting across Victoria and riverland NSW. Thank you to Committee, all those who volunteer in sub-Committees and those who volunteer for AQC and Showcase and other activities, for your contribution to VicQuilters. VicQuilters cannot operate without the generosity of the many members who volunteer their time and energy in the various aspects of VicQuilters activities.

#### **Group Insurance**

### **Quilt Appraisals**

This last 12 months started rather isolating for the person who was asked to assist the previous appraisal Co-ordinator, then informed that they had resigned. Following discussion, it was proposed that Heather Shepherd would take on the role of Co-ordinator, Robyn Roberts would be the Policy & Manual update person and Yumi McKey would take on the role of Administer.

After approval from Victorian Quilters Inc., we looked for another venue that was well lit and not only had heating but also cooling. This venue was found in Thornbury at a muchreduced rent from \$160/per session to \$62/session to the guild.

We commenced the year with 2 trainees and have managed to increase our trainees to 5 but have finished the year with 1 graduating. Both Robyn Roberts and Heather Shepherd have also learnt Yumi McKey's roll so she has time on the tables to learn and, should she not be available, someone can fill in.

The number of appraisal sessions per year have increased from 4 to 7. The average number hours worked was 210 up from 130 with attendees also up from 31 to 61 which on percentage scale 55% to 71%. At the end of each session, we endeavour to have a discussion to keep the team members up to date and also to allows them to bring up any topics for discussion. This is working well according to our team members.

We have also been in discussion with an experienced long arm quilter, a machine embroiderer and an art quilter for our education sessions so we all keep up to date with methods, latest techniques etc. Both Robyn Roberts and Heather Shepherd have visited many Guilds to inform them about Quilt Appraisal, including offering 2 quilt Appraisals as prizes at Victorian Quilters Inc. annual quilt Showcase.

I wish to thank the team for all their hard work throughout the year, especially on Wednesday 13th November when we were requested to appraise the Australian Red Cross quilt collection which commenced at 9am (due to large number of items to be appraised – 38) and concluded at 5.30pm.

Members and visitors to the show enjoyed seeing the amazing quilts, catching up with friends, making new friends and shopping. As well as the quilts in our judged show, we had a wonderful display of prize-winning quilts from our Profile a Quilter, Eileen Campbell.

Australian Quilters Association Inc. (AQA) showcased the red and white quilts their members had made to celebrate their 40th birthday. We also displayed quilts that members of Bay Quilters Inc. made to celebrate their 30th birthday.

Thank you to our members who entered their quilts and congratulations to those who won a prize. Please remember, that our show is more than winning a prize and we welcome all quilts into our show, especially those simple or beginner quilts. This Exhibition is to display quilts recently completed by members and we want to encourage new quilters, who can sometimes be discouraged by the many complex quilts on display. We love to see a range of quilts and you never know which quilt may inspire someone to make their first quilt. Please consider entering your quilt in 2025.

There are many people to thank for ensuring that Quilt Showcase 2024 was a success: • The Quilt Collection volunteers - these ladies not only collect and transport your quilts, they also help with the putting up and taking down of the show, so their support is invaluable to Victorian Quilters. This year our collectors were Tania Tanti, Linda Crouch, Kaye Hardman, Judith Oke, Lyn Cooper, Margaret Parkinson, Carole Egan, Wendy Blyth, Val Jackson, Maureen Mackie and Marie Lee.

• Thank you to Marie Lee for organising sponsorship, so that as many entrants as possible received a prize in the show and to Shirley Lodington who created all the certificates and sponsor cards and prize notifications. Thank you to Anna Amory who helped process the entries this year and Jennifer Wain who created the artist statement cards. Showcase is a massive undertaking every year and it is not until you become involved that you realise all the work that goes on behind the scenes. The committee work very hard to put on our show every year but we would welcome more help from members, even a small job means that it takes the pressure off somebody else.

• Lyn Cooper organised the raffle tickets, Jennifer Wain looked after our finances, Heather Connor did our PowerPoint Display at the opening and President Judith Oke and Past President Marie Lee are constantly working in the background and are always a reliable help to make our show run smoothly.

• Our Arc Angel was Anna Amory, who did a wonderful job of welcoming and

instructing our many white glove volunteers. Thank you also to the white glove volunteers who keep those quilts safe and help visitors with their enquiries.

• The ladies and gentlemen who helped put up the quilt stands and/ or helped with judging day by sorting, managing the quilts for the judges to view and then hanging them and taking down the show. Their support is invaluable.

This year our raffle quilt named 'Symmetry' was made by Wendy Blyth and quilted by Jenny Gibson. The winner of the quilt was Kelly Hamlyn-Harris and Betty Scott won the BERNINA 325 sewing machine.

172 quilts were entered and the most popular category was the Recycle Challenge with 17 quilts. This was an amazing effort considering that members were given little notice to make their quilts. Recycling of textiles is a very important issue and we will have the Recycle challenge again in 2025.

The Judges, Lee Vause, Vicki Jenkin and Heather Shepherd, reported that the standard of quilts was very high. They asked entrants to ensure the quilts entered have been carefully squared, blocked and that the bindings are full and neat.

On behalf of all members, we also extend congratulations to Linda Crouch for her spectacular Best of Show quilt, 'A Magical Winter Garden'.

Our most valuable asset are the volunteers who attend to the tasks that make the presentation look so professional & sophisticated. Unfortunately, some of these volunteers are experiencing strength & stamina challenges. We need more able bodies to spread the work load. If you can help us with setting up the show, packing up the show or volunteering while the show is in progress by doing white glove duty, please contact us. Many hands make light work.

Once again, I thank everyone who has helped with Showcase this year, your support is invaluable.

Lastly, but by far not the least, is our continued partnership with Expertise Events and BERNINA Australia. Without the support of these two companies, we could not present the calibre of Quilt Showcase Exhibition each year. We thank them for their support and look forward to working with them with in the future.

#### Very Snuggly Quilts

The team of volunteers continues to visit the Royal Children's Hospital each month. We have now been visiting the hospital for 25 years and during this time have donated in excess of 20,000 quilts. These quilts have a value in excess of \$4 million dollars.

Thank you to the generosity of so many people we are able to continue this valuable work. The quilts make a huge difference to the children and their families as well as lifting the spirits of all the staff. There is a real buzz at the hospital the day the "Quilt Ladies" visit.

Josephine Kelly coordinates the distribution of quilts and you may deliver completed quilts to her at a mutually agreed time. Please remember that Josephine has a full-time job and we need to work in with her schedule.

Elaine Hicks continues to coordinate the volunteers who deliver the quilts to the hospital. We are very privileged to be able to enter the wards and there are agreed protocols that cover the legal requirements of delivering quilts to children who have chronic illnesses and special needs.

During the past year fabric has been passed onto other Auxiliaries as well as organisations that make items for a range of charitable organisations. We have amassed a considerable amount of fabric and have sorted and sold some fabric during the year. The money raised has contributed to paying for storage of the quilts and fabric.

This year Victorian Quilters assisted the Auxiliary and Foundation by proving a raffle quilt to raise funds for the Dame Elisabeth Murdoch Nursing Development Scholarship which offers a unique opportunity for an outstanding nurse at The Royal Children's Hospital (RCH) to

further develop their career and change the future of paediatric healthcare. To date, 15 incredible nurses have been supported through the scholarship, which is made possible thanks to the RCH Auxiliaries.

We have also provided other quilts to Auxiliaries to assist them to raise much needed funds for equipment and research. My thanks to the generous Victorian Quilters Members for their generosity in making these quilts available.
